Tot Park **Project Kickoffs** April 12!

Mifflinburg Community Parks Actions Projects (Miff CPAP) and Willow Playworks invite you to participate in the Tot Lot Community Build Project on Saturday, April 12. (Rain Date: April 19)

The long-awaited playground will be located at the west end of the Mifflinburg Community Park at the site of the old mini-golf course. Groundbreaking for the project is scheduled for March 24.


The \$400,000 Tot Lot playground is designed for children ages 2 to 5 and features two large climbing pieces with slides, a climbing dome, a three-piece musical instrument section, a train house, a play house, an Around the Bend structure with handrails, a merry-go-round, swings and a four-person seesaw. It will have a special safety surface and much of the new equipment is handicapped accessible.

Karen Musser, co-founder and president of Miff CPAP, says their goal is to get 100 volunteers to come out to help build the park. in addition serving food to the workers. No experience is necessary to volunteer.

Special activities for kids are planned throughout the day. Kids can enjoy a visit from the COOL Bus Mobile Art Studio & Classroom from 1 to 2 p.m. Kids can pet live bunnies, participate in special bunny crafts and more. The activities are free; however, donations will be accepted.

The project is paid for through American Rescue Plan funds, grants through the state Department of Community and Economic Development and local matches from businesses. Playworld, Idding's Quarry, Gutelius





Excavating and Willow Playworks also contributed.

HELP US HELP YOU BE IN THE KNOW

The Borough of Mifflinburg uses a Public Notification System that allows the Borough to relay emergency information to those that are signed up with their current phone numbers or email addresses. It is called the RAVE notification system. The Borough uses the Rave notification system to notify residents/customers of upcoming projects that may impact utility services or other emergency information.

If you have changed your phone number or purchased a property in the Borough within the last year or so, we urge you to reach out to the office at 570-966-1013 to ensure that your current phone number and or email address is the one in the notification system. Thank you for your assistance.

UTILITY BILL FORMAT CHANGE & DELIVERY ISSUES

The Borough began experiencing issues with the delivery of the monthly utility bills in 2024. Although the bills had been mailed out as usual, the Postal Service's bulk processing was either damaging or losing our bills due to the postcard size. The Borough was advised to consider changing to a standard bill in an envelope. The Borough worked to make this change beginning with the first billing in 2025. Although we've experienced a few glitches, the borough is hopeful that the new

format is more helpful and appealing to our customers.

As a reminder, the Borough mails the utility bills out so that you should receive it around the first of the month, and the bills are due by the 20th of each month. If you fail to receive your bill by the 7th of the month, please contact the Borough office to get a copy of your bill or log in to your account to get the balances owed. We appreciate your patience as we work through this change.

ELECTRONIC BILL PAYMENT

Hate going outside in the cold and inclement weather? Tired of paying late or convenience fees? Maybe it's time to sign up for Electronic Bill payment! The Borough offers customers the opportunity to sign up to have their utility bill automatically deducted from their checking or savings account at no additional charge to you. It's quick and easy to sign up and can save you from battling the elements or from paying late or convenience fees. ONLINE CREDIT CARD PAYMENT SYSTEM FOR UTILITY BILLS

The Borough of Mifflinburg also offers an online credit card processing option for payment of Utility bills. This online payment system is available through a URL link and the link and instructions are available on the Borough's website. This option does allow customers who register for an account to see account usage and payment histories in addition to making credit card payments.

Unlike the Electronic Bill Payment Option, this payment method does assess a convenience fee, which is paid to the Card Processing Company handling these transactions.

Customers needing assistance with registering their account may contact the Borough Office with questions.

UTILITY TERMINATION FOR NON-PAYMENT

Utility customers are reminded that all past due accounts must be paid up and current by April 23, 2025. Accounts that remain delinguent after April 23, 2025 will be terminated on April 24, 2025. Individuals with guestions about their delinquent accounts should contact the Borough office. Customers with good payment histories may make written payment arrangements if they stop by the Borough Office to sign a Payment Agreement before 9 a.m. on April 24.

We understand that it can be difficult to keep up with electrical bills throughout the cold months. However, beginning in April delinguent accounts will be terminated for non-payment. If you are looking for assistance with paying your bill, please contact the Borough office for a list of possible resources.

If you plan to seek assistance for your bill from third parties, we ask that you **do not put it off until the last minute.** Begin the process in a timely manner so that those payments can be received by the Borough Office prior to April 23, 2025.

Please understand that when services have been terminated for non-payment, payment of the entire account balance (not iust the delinguent amount) plus the \$60 service charge must be paid in full before the utility service can be restored. Remember online credit card payments can be only be made through the Borough's website. If you are paying in person, the Borough does not accept credit or debit cards or post-dated checks, only cash, check or money order payments may be used. Restoration of service can only be done during normal working hours of 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., and someone must be home at the time of restoration for safety reasons.

NEWS FROM CHIEF HACKENBURG

Pennsylvania's Vehicle Code considers "pedalcycles" as vehicles and provides that every person riding a pedalcycle upon a roadway shall be granted all of the rights and responsibilities applicable to a driver of a vehicle, with certain exceptions discussed below. If you ride in violation of the traffic laws, you greatly increase your risk of a crash and will likely be found at fault in the event

- Obey all traffic laws. All traffic signals must be obeyed in accordance with standard vehicle laws. If a traffic signal does not detect you, you may treat the red signal as a stop sign and proceed through the intersection after vielding to all intersecting traffic (including pedestrians).
- Always wear a helmet. Pennsylvania law requires all cyclists under age 12 to wear an approved bicycle helmet. This applies to anyone under 12 operating the bicycle, riding as a passenger, or riding in an attached restraining seat or
- Never ride against the flow of traffic.
- Automobiles are not required to yield to bicycles being ridden across a crosswalk (at a trail crossing for example) as the bicycle is treated as a vehicle. A better choice is to dismount and walk your bike across.
- Motor vehicles must allow 4 feet of distance when overtaking a bicycle and travel at a careful and prudent speed. It is the motorist's responsibility to provide this distance, not that of the cyclist.

• Borough Ordinance: It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a bicycle upon any sidewalk in the Borough, but it shall be lawful for persons to push bicycles by hand upon or across any sidewalk.

PEDESTRIANS

- When a pedestrian crosses the street in a crosswalk, the driver must yield.
- Drivers are not required to yield until you begin to step into the crosswalk.
- Pedestrians should not walk or run unexpectedly into the path of a moving vehicle. Pedestrians should not assume drivers will see or yield. Look left, right, and left again before stepping out.
- If a pedestrian crosses the street not at an intersection and there is no crosswalk, the pedestrian must yield to vehicles.
- When walking along a road with sidewalks and its use is practicable, it is unlawful for any pedestrian to walk along and upon an adjacent roadway. (PA Vehicle Code)

SPRING DROP OFF

Mifflinburg Borough will again hold the annual spring dropoff event at the Borough's maintenance facility near the recycling center. The times permitted for the disposing of items will be:

This event is for **BOROUGH RESIDENTS ONLY** – those who pay their utilities to the Borough. ** **Borough employees will require proof of residency for those using this site** (photo ID or Borough utility bill will suffice). Non-residents attempting to use this site will be asked to leave and may be subject to legal action and/or prosecution. Please help us keep this valuable event for our residents, those who contribute to the budget that pays for this event, by following the rules.

Residents may bring their waste materials, yard waste, etc. to the location above for disposal and transfer to the Lycoming County Landfill. Items that are not accepted by the landfill cannot be accepted at this event. Therefore, recyclables, tires, paint, shellac, varnish, batteries, and electronics cannot be accepted by the Borough. Construction materials are also not accepted.

There will be a fee assessed for any items that contain refrigerant (air conditioners, freezers, refrigerators, etc.). This fee will cover the expense of removing the refrigerant prior to disposal and must be paid at the time of drop-off.

Please call the Union County Planning Department or check their website for details about recycling options for electronics.

Borough employees will be operating the drop-off site during the hours listed above and assisting residents with off-loading of vehicles into the waste containers. *Please visit the Borough's website for more details*. Unfortunately, the Borough will NOT be available to pick-up any waste material at residences or businesses. There will be no exceptions. Absolutely no other drop-off arrangements will be permitted other than as noted above. Dropping off or dumping of materials at times other than as noted herein will be considered littering and subject to legal action and/or prosecution. Dropping off or dumping of unacceptable items will also be subject to legal action and/or prosecution. The site will open and close promptly at the times listed.

TORNADO SIREN TEST SET FOR APRIL 5

The Borough of Mifflinburg and the Mifflinburg Hose Company will be testing the Tornado Siren on Saturday, April 5, 2025 at noon. If there is inclement weather, this test will be postponed for until Saturday. April 12, 2025 at the same time.

This siren (alarm) system for the Borough of Mifflinburg has been approved to allow for activation of a siren warning system that can be activated by the Emergency Management Coordinator or local first responders. The intent of this system is to provide advanced notice, when possible, of a tornado warning for our immediate area. This system would be activated when the National Weather Service issues a tornado warning in our area, giving residents some advanced notice of imminent weather conditions. Thank you for your patience as we test this system.

HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Borough will be flushing all fire hydrants on Wednesday, April 30, 2025 (rain date May 1, 2025). This work will begin around mid-day and will continue until complete, probably early evening. This is routine maintenance is conducted to re-

move settled materials, loose deposits of iron and other depositions from the water mains. This will only be completed if water supplies are adequate at this time.

Customers may notice brief periods of discolored water or low water pressure during the flushing process. It is recommended that customers refrain from clothes washing during hydrant flushing since the iron deposits may stain clothing.

WELCOME SPRING!

We have finally experienced a couple of glimpses of spring over the past few weeks and I think we're all ready to see more! Here are a few reminders for when things start to turn green.

- Please remember that grass must be kept to a height of no more than 6 inches. This keeps Mifflinburg looking clean and green and cuts down on pests.
- Please do not put grass clippings, brush, garbage or leaves in the streets. This can cause storm sewers to clog which can cause flooding for you and your neighbors and it can cause damage to the street sweeper. Not to mention the fact that it's illegal and violators can be fined.
- Please keep the plants around your electric meter trimmed so that our workers can access that area to read, repair or replace your meter.
- Please keep the plants along sidewalks, alleys and intersections trimmed to allow a clear sight distance for drivers and to keep from scratching or damaging vehicles.

Thanks for helping to keep Mifflinburg clean and green this year!

PETS AND POOP!

They seem to go hand-in-hand ... Well, they should anyway! Let's explain: not only are residents required to keep dogs 'at hand' and under control (on a leash) when walking them within the Borough, but Borough ordinance also requires that you take 'poop matters' to hand as well. Please clean up after your pet! Anyone who is caught purposely leaving animal waste on someone else's property or sidewalks is subject to a fine.

Please also be reminded that pets are not permitted within the Borough Parks, except for the specified dog park area and residents should keep all unattended pets confined to your own property.

And as long as we're talking about pets, please remember that pet owners should also do their best to keep their cats and their business to their own property too. We want everyone to be able to get out and enjoy the outdoors as spring arrives!

STREET SWEEPING

As long as we're all thinking about spring cleaning, here is a reminder that the Borough has a regular street sweeping schedule. Please remember to pay close attention to the parking rules and regulations for your Street. The Borough's Street Sweeping Schedule is available on the Borough's website; mifflinburgborough.org.



Mifflinburg Meals on Wheels seeks volunteers, drivers

Since 1972, Lewisburg & Milton Meals on Wheels has been providing hot home delivered meals to residents. Today, 53 years later, they deliver hot meals to a much larger area. They currently deliver meals from Watsontown to Winfield, and Montandon to Mazeppa.

Volunteers often get calls to see if there is delivery to Mifflinburg, and they have to say no; however, this is something they would like to do. The biggest obstacle preventing them from delivering meals to Mifflinburg is a lack of volunteers. Meals are provided Monday through Friday. At a minimum, that is five delivery people per week. With a team of ten delivery people, the delivery person will only need to go out every other week; or, the delivery person could go more than once a week – there is flexibility!

Meals are prepared at and picked up from RiverWoods in Lewisburg. Depending on the response to this request, a drop off point could be established in Mifflinburg so that drivers do not have to return to Lewisburg but instead could drop off the insulated bags for the driver the following day. Time commitment would be about an hour and a half. All volunteers fill out an application and pass a criminal background check.
